



Welcome to the communities

At Roskilde University:

- as a new student, you will be welcomed through an introduction programme, where you get to know the other students and the university
- you and the other students have your own house, Studenterhuset, which is run by students on a voluntary basis and is open to everyone
- students can apply to the Study Environment Fund for money for specific ideas that improve the study environment

- you will meet study environment tutors in all the programme environments (i.e. students employed to enhance the study environment)

At Roskilde University, you put theory into practice

Every semester (i.e. every six months) you will write one major project alongside your courses. In the project, you work on a problem chosen by you and your group.

What's special about project work?

The reseachers guide you, and they are extremely dedicated while also challenging you to work on a high academic level."
